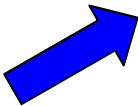

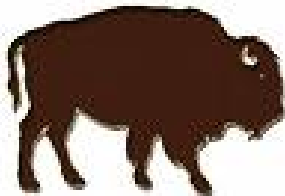

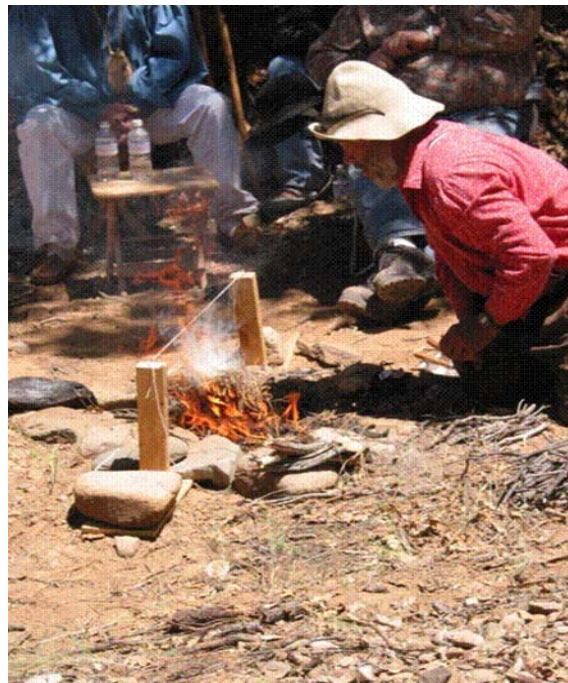

## 2009 Mountainmen/Plainsmen Territorial Rendezvous Events

### Scout Competition

A competition will be held to determine the National Scout representing their Territory and the Territorial Scout to serve the territory for a two year term. All chapter scouts and assistant chapter scouts are eligible to compete. The competition will include testing on hawk/knife throwing, blackpowder shooting/archery, firestarting, outfits, RR achievement and FCF achievement. Winner of the competition will be named National Scout.

There will be a separate competition for each territory

### Tres Piedras Trail Events

An age-old timed trail walk testing the ability of the trapping company's best frontiersmen. Events will include different spins on the timeless Mountainman standards - shooting, throwing, firestarting, etc. Expect some surprises. Some nice smokepoles will be up for grabs for the top Old Timer and Young Buck.

### Frontier Classes

Spend some time learning valuable frontier skills from some of the Territories grizzled old timers. Gain insight into blacksmithing, hatsmithing, trekking, leathercraft, etc.

### Cooking Competition

How can this be a competition - everybody wins, especially the judges. Competitors will cook up their finest meals including a meat, side item, bread, dessert, and beverage. Meals will be graded on authenticity, presentation, and taste. Team with the best presentation in taste and looks will garner some nice prizes. To be held Friday afternoon.

### Territorial Rendezvous Stew

**Come and sample some the finest vittles ever made. Enjoy the fellowship and friendship of the Territories mountainmen as we share together a meal of the Rendezvous. Everyone required to bring a canned vegetable or a meat (Beef only please)**

### Mission Auction

To Give and Serve - support the Territorial Missions Project by bidding on some very nice frontier wares. Many items available in the auction will have been made by Wilderness members from throughout the Territory. Hand-crafted knives, hats, clothing, accoutrements will all be available.

### Traders Row

A lantern-lit event to be held after the evening service on Thursday. Trade for some of those much needed provisions (hats, beads, patches, knives) and the such. Traders Row will be a fine opportunity for Oldtimers to help outfit and equip a Youngbuck.

### Horn Blowing Competition

The frontiersmen from the Mountainmen and Plainsmen Territories are well known for expelling the warm wind. Prove yer abilities and win some nice prizes. Young Buck and Old Timer competitions.

### Young Buck Stump Preaching

There will be opportunities for Young Bucks to deliver the Word during the morning devotion time. Please contact one of the Territorial Rep's if a Young Buck would like to preach in one of these time slots.

**Frontier Vendors** Vendors are more than welcome to setup at the Rendezvous site and sell their wares. Many new FCF members will need to enhance their outfits and persona with goods from quality vendors. The Old Timers like the goods too. Please contact the Territorial Rep if you plan to setup as a vendor as a minimal fee will be required (a quality item to be donated for the mission's auction).

**Candle Shoot:** This is a night shoot that is loads of fun. **NOTE:** There is a \$2.00 entry fee for the candle shoot. All Proceeds go towards the missions offering

## **2009 Mountainmen/Plainsmen Territorial Rendezvous Notes**

Those attending camp must be active FCF members

Participants should strive to be in FCF attire soon after arrival and for the duration of the camp.

The era portrayed is the fur trade period - Pre 1840.

No hand guns are allowed at Royal Rangers events.

No loaded firearms are allowed in camp (this includes percussion caps).

There are to be no modern shelters in the area designated as primitive.

Lighting is to be period as well. If you must have Coleman or electric lights these are to remain inside your shelter.

All modern items, such as water containers and coolers, should be covered. This will make photography much more authentic in appearance.

Your fires are your responsibility. Keep them under control. If local requirements are for fire pits, bring your own and support it at least 6" off the ground. <site dependent>

Ashes should be well soaked, dead out and placed in one central location, this spot will be announced at the camp.

Down dead wood may be collected and burned. Absolutely no cutting on live trees or bushes. <site dependent>

First aid will be available at the registration camp.

Campers are responsible for all their actions.

Schedules, event results, news and notices will be posted at the registration area.

**Absolutely no dogs or pets allowed in camp.**

Commanders are responsible for the safety and well being of boys in their care. Be aware of where and what they are doing.

All persons must register before being allowed to set up camp. Registered campers should wear the event medallion whenever possible.

Quiet time is the hours of 11pm to daylight. Please be kind to those around you.

All vehicles will come in on the service road, unload, and then be driven back to parking lot. After camp is over and you have packed, have your camp completely ready to load prior to bringing in your vehicle, quickly load and take vehicle back to the parking lot. <site dependent>

Shooting will be supervised by an official NRA/NMLRA range master. **Bring your shooter's card.**

**All persons shooting a black powder firearms must have an approved "black powder card," NMLRA certified, or approved by the national office.**

All garbage and trash will be hauled away; we will clean the entire camp.

All persons under 18 must have the "permission slip" signed by parent or guardian authorizing them to shoot and handle a firearm - Black Powder/Knife Permission Slip.

Visitors are only allowed in camp from 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. daily. Event registered campers are responsible for all their visitors on the Territorial site during the visiting hours. Please abide by these rules.

**The Rendezvous Stew is for all REGISTERED Participants. Please make sure you bring either a vegetable or meat (Beef and precooked) to the registration area on Thursday around noon.**

## **2009 Mountainmen/Plainsmen Territorial Rendezvous - Tres Piedras Trail**

### **The Tres Piedras Trail**

The Tres Piedras Trail will be a series of events that will test the abilities of the best frontiersmen in the region. Old Timers and Young Bucks alike will be challenged by events they will encounter along the Tres Piedras Trail. Participants will be required to complete five out of six series of events with there being a choice between Black Powder shooting and Archery. There will be a total of 500 points possible with the top scoring Old Timer and Young Buck earning the right to take home a fine muzzleloading rifle.

### **Black Powder**

Three 30 point regular shooting events and two 5 point bonus events. Total possible for the black powder shooting event is 100 points.

1. The participant will take three shots at a 10 point bullseye target from 25 yards. The three shots will be scored cumulatively based on the point value of rings shot with the best possible score being 30 points. The majority of the ball will be scored. A tear or rip of a higher scoring ring will not be applicable.
2. The participant will take three shots at three clay pigeons from 50 yards. Each broken clay pigeon will earn the participant 10 points with a total of 30 points for the event.
3. The participant will take three shots at a steel squirrel that will pop-up from a stump and will only stay visible for 3 seconds. There will be three stumps from which the squirrel can appear. The sequence at which the squirrel will appear will be random.

### **Bonus**

1. 1 shot at a Tootsie Pop at 25 yards. Earn 5 points for destroying the Tootsie Pop or lose 5 points from your regular score with a miss.
2. 1 shot at a small inflated balloon at 25 yards. Pop the balloon and earn 5 points or lose 5 points with a miss from your regular shooting score.

### **Archery**

Three 30 point regular shooting events and two 5 point bonus events. Total possible for the archery event is 100 points.

1. 3 shots at a bullseye target at 20 yards. The three shots will be scored cumulatively based on the point value of rings shot with the best possible score being 30 points.
2. 3 shots at a bullseye target at 30 yards. The three shots will be scored cumulatively based on the point value of rings shot with the best possible score being 30 points.
3. 3 shots at a bullseye target at 40 yards. The three shots will be scored cumulatively based on the point value of rings shot with the best possible score being 30 points.

### **Bonus**

1. 1 shot at a small inflated balloon at 20 yards. Pop the balloon and earn 5 points or lose 5 points with a miss from your regular shooting score.
2. 1 shot at a bullseye target at 50 yards. Score an 8 or better and earn 5 points or miss and lose 5 points from your overall Archery score.

### **Hawk**

Three 30 point regular throwing events and two 5 point bonus events. Total possible for the Hawk throwing event is 100 points.

1. Three regular throws at a 16 inch wood target. Each stick earns 10 points with a total possible score of 30 points.
2. Three double revolution throws at a 16 inch wood target. Each stick earns 10 points with a total possible score of 30 points.
3. Three regular throws at a 16 inch wood swinging target. Each stick earns 10 points with a total possible score of 30 points.

### **Bonus**

1. 1 regular throw at a 16 inch wood target. Earn 5 points by cutting a playing card placed on the target. Lose 5 point from your overall Hawk throwing score with a miss.
2. 3 regular throws at an 8 inch wood target. Get one stick out of the three throws and earn 5 points. Miss all three throws and lose 5 points from your overall Hawk throwing score.

## **2009 Plainsmen Territorial Rendezvous - Tres Piedras Trail**

The Tres Piedras Trail cont...

### **Knife**

Three 30 point regular throwing events and two 5 point bonus events. Total possible for the Knife throwing event is 100 points.

1. Three regular throws at a 16 inch wood target. Each stick earns 10 points with a total possible score of 30 points
2. Three throws from beyond 15 yards at a 16 inch wood target. Each stick earns 10 points with a total possible score of 30 points.
3. Three regular throws at a 16 inch wood swinging target. Each stick earns 10 points with a total possible score of 30 points.

### **Bonus**

1. 1 regular throw at a 16 inch wood target. Earn 5 points by cutting a playing card placed on the target. Lose 5 point from your overall Hawk throwing score with a miss.
2. 3 regular throws at an 8 inch wood target. Get one stick out of the three throws and earn 5 points. Miss all three throws and lose 5 points from your overall Knife throwing score.

### **Flint & Steel**

Three 30 point regular Fire Building events and one 10 point bonus event. Total possible for the Fire Building event is 100 points.

1. Start a fire (flame) with flint and steel.  
1-10 seconds - 30 points  
11-30 seconds - 20 points  
31 seconds - 2 minutes - 10 points  
2 minutes - 4 minutes - 5 points
2. In twenty minutes, start a fire with flint and steel and mold as many lead balls as possible - max 30 balls made for 30 points. One point for each ball made up to 30. Lead, molds, smelting pots, and ladles will be provided.
3. Start a fire with flint and steel and burn through a string strung at 1 ½ feet above the fire. Total number of minutes required to burn string subtracted from 30 provides score.

### **Bonus**

1. Start a fire (flame) in four minutes using the Bow and Drill method. Get a flame in 4 minutes and earn 10 points. Lose 10 points from your overall Flint & Steel score with no flame.
